Your first point of contact is the Department you are interested in applying for a graduate program:

Apply early for awards, scholarships, and funding and inquire with your department for available funding opportunities.

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Application deadlines and requirements vary by Department.

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There is a \$100 CAD application fee.

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Consult with the Department if you require a supervisor before admission is considered.

Your application will be assessed by your respective Department. An Official Admission Approval Letter is issued by the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research.

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If you are an international student, you must apply for a study permit before you come to Canada. An official acceptance letter from a Designated Learning Institution. It is required that you apply early.

The application requires digital copies (PDF - view instructions) of official documents. The documents are considered "unofficial" and will be used for the initial evaluation of the application.

Once admitted, you will be required to send original documents to clear your conditions of admission.
