In 2017, the University of Alberta will be launching a new course-based graduate degree program in planning.

- An emphasis on land use planning and policy development to enhance community resilience to economic, social, and environmental challenges
- Program designed in line with professional accreditation standards
- > 2 year and 1 year streams

## Two Year Regular Stream:

- Four year undergraduate degree from a recognized University
- > Minimum B average on last 60 credits

## One Year Accelerated Stream:

- Undergraduate degree in planning and two or more calendar years professional experience in Planning, or
- Case by case assessment of other combinations of experience and degrees
